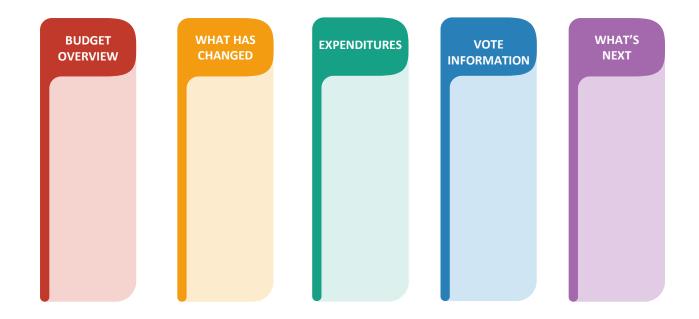

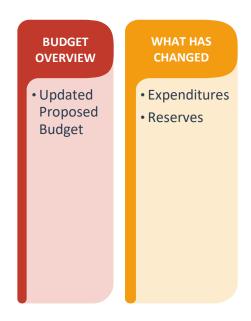
PROPERTY TAX LEVY

WHAT HAS CHANGED? - EXPENDITURES

BOCES Codes

- Decreases to cover increases in other BOCES codes and based on prior year spending:
 - 2250.490-21-4 BOCES East Hdcp
 - 2250.490-24-2 Option 2
- 2250.490-24-3 Option 3 Increased based on enrollment and required services.
- 2250.490-24-4 Option 4 Increased based on enrollment and required services.
- Transfer to Capital (9550.900)
 - Additional \$225,000 to cover the cost of all proposed projects
 - Discussed in budget review session #1
 - Does not affect the tax levy



PROPOSED CHANGES- EXPENDITURES

- Board of Education (1010)
 - Add \$30,000 to Equipment (A1010.200) for the purchase and installation of video screens in the boardroom.
 - To be offset by part of the anticipated increase in State Aid



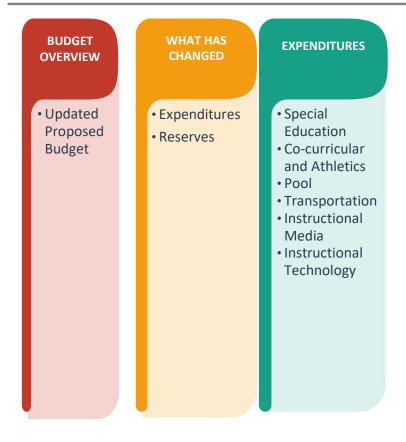

SPECIAL EDUCATION

- ABA Training
 - Determined by student's IEP
- Contractual increases for salaries
- Teaching Assistants
 - Directly related to a student's IEP
- Home Tutoring
 - SED requirement 15 hours per week per subject area
- BOCES Codes
 - Reallocation and increases based on services and enrollments
 - Option 3 a popular program in BOCES for students with specific needs that cannot be met in district
 - Increased needs
 - The PPS Department is working on controlling costs
- Private School Tuition and Related Services
 - Increase in related services and increase in rates for our special needs students
 - Occupational education
 - Wilson Tech based on 89 students attending (tuition is calculated on a 2 year enrollment average)
 - Secondary Summer School BOCES
 - Continuation of Alternative HS and Restorative HS in district



PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES

- Central Registration/Attendance
 - Compliance with Attorney General requirements
- Guidance
 - Contractual increases
- Health services
 - Contractual salary increases for nurses
 - Contracts for services paid to other districts hosting Deer Park resident students in private schools
- Psychological Services and Social Workers
 - JQA positions are grant funded
 - Addition of 1 psychologist at JFK
- Pupil Personnel Services
 - Contractual increases
- Speech Correction Services
 - HS position is grant funded
- ENL
 - Contractual salary increases



CO-CURRICULAR AND ATHLETICS

Co-Curricular

- Maintains all clubs from this year
 - Addition of Take a Look at Teaching that was previously grant funded
 - Intramurals

Athletics/Marching Band

- Marching Band Equipment new podium
- Coaching
 - Contractual increases
- Equipment (\$30,000)
 - Soccer goals, wrestling mats, baseball pitching machine, basketball shooting machine
- Professional and Technical (\$10,000)
 - For substitute athletic trainers as needed
- Fees (\$115,000)
 - HS cheer and kickline competitions
 - Unified Bowling and Basketball
 - Referee fees potential for additional increases with expiring CBA
- Repairs/contracts
 - AED Maintenance, equipment maintenance, HUDL



POOL

- Repairs/Contracts (\$5,000)
 - Most repairs go through the main building repair code for the HS
 - 2024-2025 Repair cost to date (including supplies and equipment, as needed: \$22,138)
 - Does not include in-house labor/overtime
- Office and First Aid Supplies (\$5,000)
 - Rescue tubes, deck storage boxes, first aid supplies
- Supplies/Chemicals (\$15,000)



TRANSPORTATION

- Buses (\$495,000)
 - Purchase of 3 big buses and 1 van
 - Continuing transition plan study for electric vehicle use mandate
- Professional Services and Tolls (\$21,200)
 - Includes mandatory drug testing
 - EZ-Pass
- Repairs/Maintenance Contract (\$360,500)
 - For maintenance of buses and non-DOT vehicles
 - Contract expires 6/30/25 bid preparation is in process
- Parts used for repairs not in contract (\$525,000)
 - Overall increase in parts/supplies costs
- Fuel (\$450,000)
 - Expenditures to date \$203,950
- Contractual (\$1,300,000)
 - Special ed/homeless transportation
 - Needed for continuing driver shortages
 - Preparing RFP instead of bidding for greater flexibility and bus sharing

Library

- Salary contractual increases
- Equipment Maker Space Station for Robert Frost library
- BOCES Library
 - School library automation
 - Online resources and databases for each school

Audio Visual

- Supplies (\$20,199)
 - Various supplies including batteries, laminating materials, office supplies, microphones

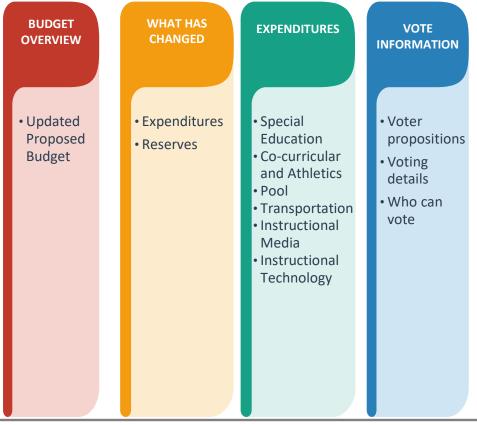


INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY

- Non-instructional salaries
 - Contractual increases
 - Equipment (\$300,000)
 - Most equipment is purchased through BOCES
 - Includes contingency funds for emergencies
- Repairs and Contracts (\$20,610)
 - Cisco smart net, backup storage, checkpoint, barracuda, chromebook repairs, device license renewals
- BOCES Learning Technology (\$2,860,000)
 - Installation of Verkada cameras in remaining school buildings
 - Chromebooks/iPads touchscreen devices
 - Custom Computer tech support
 - Various software licenses
 - Monitoring solutions web filters
 - Internet services

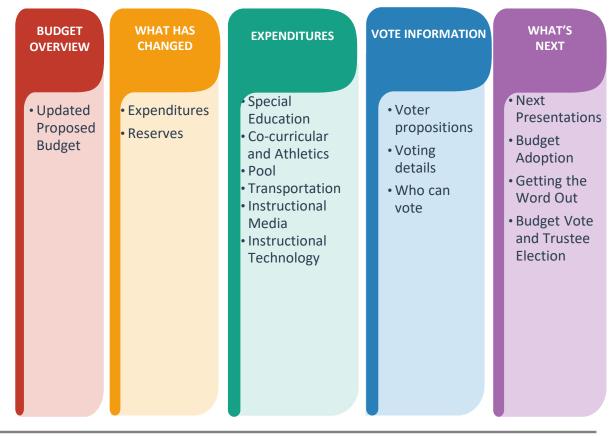
