Upon a motion by Mrs. Elliott, seconded by Mr. Centamore, the Board of Education unanimously approved the following Resolution:

**HIGH SCHOOL** 

**RESOLVED,** that the Board of Education accept a monetary donation of \$195.00 from an anonymous patron of Starbucks to benefit the Life Skills Falcon Fuel Program. The money will be used to replenish supplies and add additional goods to their program.

- As we progress through the process it is important to use this as a benchmark for the proposed changes, as programs, class size, and personnel are 3 of our driving factors.
- What is presented at these sessions are proposals.
- The opportunity exists to change any of the items, now until April 9, prior to adoption of budget.
- Input is welcome during discussions. It is OK to 'agree to disagree'. Margie will pause periodically through out to obtain feedback. It is important we have one speaker at a time, respecting any difference of opinion.
- For those that may be participating for the first time, it is also important to note that Deer Park is one of the few districts that goes into their budget process with solutions readily in hand for review, not seeking out options for the first time in these forums.
- For those that have participated in years past, you will see once again that our budget process is not typical of others, as it is the exception...a direct reflection of the of time, effort, and experience displayed on behalf of Eva/Margie/Jim.
- We are confident we will achieve all of our 3 benchmark targets.
